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² "Relevant official" is the Governor or a person appointed by him/her to carry out registration and voting-related duties.

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(Please read these notes and instructions carefully before completing the form)

1. In order to be included on the postal voters list (or the supplement to the postal voters list), you have to be registered on the current register of electors. If you are applying for inclusion in the supplement to the postal voters list (see below) and you are not on the current register of electors, you should also apply for inclusion on the supplement to the register of electors by completing this form – Form RFA4.

A prisoner who is included on the postal voters list or supplement thereto, will be able to vote by post at an election or referendum, as appropriate, which is held during the period of the current register. (Form RFG must be submitted by 25th November to apply for inclusion in the postal voters list; Form RFG1 must be submitted if applying after 25th November, in order to be included in the supplement to the postal voters list).

2. To be included in the supplement to the register, you:
 - (a) must be 18 years of age or over (see note 3);
 - (b) must not be already registered as an elector;
 - (c) will be deemed to be ordinarily resident at the address at which you would have been residing but for your detention in prison, and entered on the register accordingly.
3. In relation to 2(a) above, a person will be eligible for entry in the supplement to the register on or after the day on which the person reaches eighteen years of age including such day that falls within the period beginning on the last day for the receipt of applications and ending on polling day. It would be of assistance in considering an application from a person reaching 18 years if the form is accompanied by a copy of a birth certificate or similar document.
4. A separate form must be completed and signed by each person applying for inclusion in the supplement. To avoid delay in processing your application, the form should be fully completed. The form must be handed to the relevant official of the prison who will arrange to have it posted to the registration authority for the relevant area, i.e. the City or County Council.
5. **Two versions of the register**
Since 2004, registration authorities are required to publish two versions of the register - the full register and the edited register.

The full register lists everyone who is entitled to vote and can only be used for an electoral or other statutory purpose.

The **edited register** contains the names and addresses of persons whose details can be used for a purpose other than an electoral or other statutory purpose e.g. for direct marketing use by a commercial or other organisation. If you do not want your details to be included on the edited register, you should tick (✓) the **opt out box** at section 9 of the form. If you want your registration details to be included (i.e. available for non-statutory uses), you should leave the opt out box blank.

6. **Declaration/Certificate of Identity**

The declaration at section 10 of the application form must be signed in the presence of the relevant official of the prison. If the relevant official is satisfied as to your identity, he/she will sign, date and stamp section 11 of the form.

7. If you are applying after an election or referendum has been called, please note that the application must reach the City or County Council concerned **before the fourteenth day (Sundays, public holidays and Good Friday excluded) before polling day** in order to be considered for inclusion in the supplement for that election or referendum.
8. You will be notified by the registration authority of the decision on your application and, if it is refused, you will be given the reason for the refusal. Where your application is refused, you will have the right to appeal against the ruling to the County Registrar.
9. It is an offence to fail to give the registration authority or county registrar any information required for the purpose of their duties or to knowingly give false information.
